I wonder if the regular night flys that have been proposed are just too frequent as most of those that voted for the regular night flys are nowhere to be seen on the nights.




Maybe we should review the number of night flys scheduled and reduce the number. What say you?

Another 'Biggles Murphy' report



At the end of July I had my 6th lesson on how to fly a microlight trike, had to look it up in my logbook. The trike I flew in today had a different wing, much more sensitive that what I had been used to and the conditions were a bit rough, so had to do more work.

I did the take- off, we had reached 300 or 400 feet when we hit an unexpected strong wind from the south so had some work to do. While we were on the ground the windsock was limp, so wind was a surprise to me. I have a feeling Mark Gentry, my instructor, may have been expecting something like this but of course kept it to himself. All a good learning curve and I should be aware of something different in the future.



In the conditions flying over the Bribie Passage I learnt to anticipate the trike's antics and was following the various creeks from 2000' although at one stage seemed to be stationary relative to the ground. The trike does seem to get blown about a bit but the fabric wing smooths things a lot, so far I am aware of movement but no hard jolts. Maybe that will come.



Once again I assisted with the landing, this one was a bit more difficult with a fair bit of wind and another plane parked in the take-off position, we used the radio but no response. We had the right of way so landed over him but watched him all the way. There was also a helicopter practising who was aware of

It was cold, two shirts, fleecy anorak, flying suit, gloves and helmet etc but I loved it. This is the best thing I have ever done and I cannot get enough of it. I will be analysing this flight until I go again which I hope will not be too long. I really have had a good day.

Balsa Wood is Quite toxic

Although it may look harmless like any other wood, balsa wood has a few nasty traits. When logged it must be treated as soon as possible to prevent the growth of fungus and other problems. Here is a list of just what it is dipped in after being cut into planks.

Boron Boric Acid and sodium tetraborate. Sodium Flouride. Arsenic pentoxide Sodium dichrotmate Santobrite acid.

The balsa is then kiln dried for two weeks. After processing the balsa is treated in a chamber with the following:

Bromite 128grams M3 for 24 hours at 24C.

Balsa dust is toxic. Handling balsa is risky. And putting it in your mouth is not recommended.

After years of breathing in balsa dust and handling the wood I am mildly allergic to these chemicals.

So keep this in mind when you are using balsa that it is not as harmless as it looks.

Dave and Gordon's "Grosswing"

Dave Harper has finished this model which has now had several successful flights. Gordon Scamp's is still under construction and powered by a MVVS Sport 4.6/1120 motor which will pull 35-45 amps. He prefers these as the speed controller plugs straight onto the rear of the

motor which is great if space is limited. He may even use a 60 amp speedie giving him some leeway.

The pusher prop is a folding three blade 10 x 8.

The model was designed by a gentleman named "Gross" in the mid 1930's hence the name.

Wingspan is 240.3 cm or 94.5 inches. That's big!

As you can see Gordon's has yet to have the rudder and elevons fitted.

Fuse is fully planked and he'll give it a light covering of fibreglass then spray paint it. This process should be well underway by the time you read this.

Both Dave and Gordon have had their challenges but find it very rewarding seeing it all come

together.

Those who have seen Dave's fly are impressed with it's looks and performance.

It's great to see members still like to scratch build aircraft and Dave always does a top job.
