President Bazza's Report

Hi fellow flyers. Sunday 11th March saw an influx of TMAC flyers. They had a warbirds day scheduled so the non warbirds flyers came over for a fly at Bray's Rd.

They thoroughly enjoyed the experience of being able to fly where and how they wanted. They were actually surprised that we also had the Uhlmann Road field. It is quite regimented at TMAC with most flying confined to circuits only.



Sunday 2nd April is the day scheduled for the FPV Rebels to try out the field at Bray's Rd. They will be conducting operations on the main runway with racing. There is a working Bee at Brays on that day so FPV flyers will only be flying after the working Bee as per normal. Depending on the numbers of them attending general flying may be allowed at certain times.

Bill Sharpe and myself attended a meeting with MBRC at Caboolture recently and numerous items including conditions of the new lease and mosquito spraying were discussed in depth. One thing that is not negotiable is that to be a member of SAAMBR you MUST supply the club with a mobile phone number and an email address. Should you find this unacceptable you will not be allowed to be a member of the club. This may possibly affect about 10 members, going on the current members list. The reason for this is for notification of mosquito spraying. PLEASE, if you hear a Helicopter, even before seeing it, assume that it is mosquito spraying and land IMMEDIATELY. Mosquito spraying generally occurs from October until April on various days, depending on conditions. Spraying happens on approximately 10 to 12 days per year. Records show that for the last two and one half years spraying has occurred on only three weekends with the rest being weekdays. Flying will not be allowed on the days that spraying is going to occur but members will still have access to facilities. Signs will be erected to this effect on the entrance gate and the pilots area fence. In view of the restrictions for mosquito spraying council has requested that we confine all special interest flying events from April to the end of August AND all events are to be notified to MBRC before the end of December for the following year.

Outside of this period any scheduled event could be cancelled with only 24 hours notice. It will be discussed at the April meeting as to when you as a club want to allow special interest groups to use your field. At the moment we have 4 different groups that use the field. If the

FPV drone people also want access that will make five groups that will want to use our field over a 5 month period and some of these groups schedule two uses of the field during one year.

The matter will be fully discussed at the April Meeting and the reasons for the amened conditions of membership will be explained. It will be to your advantage to attend the April meeting. Should you wish to discuss the matter before the April Meeting please contact me.

I will NOT discuss it via email. Actually the meeting with MBRC went well and we did much better out of it than was anticipated.

Councillor Peter Flannery has agreed to be our patron. As a gesture of good will he has indicated that he will donate \$300 to the club for the purchase of First Aid and snake bite Kit. I will be submitting the required forms in the near future. It is proposed to have the official opening of Gibson field on the 23rd of September in conjunction with a Warbirds day. It is Hoped that Councillor Flannery will do us the honour of opening the field. There will be a free sausage sizzle, sponsored by the club, for all persons attending on the day.



Recent trials have shown that a hotdog catering event is quite popular when organised. Eric has organised these on a few days and the Hot Doggies sell for \$2 each on a fresh bread roll. There has been an enthusiastic response to these days. We have had them on a couple of Sunday lunches. Any profits made will be put back into further caterings. This system overcomes the bad feelings generated by people indulging in the Sunday Sausage sizzle lunch without making any contribution

to food.

WW11 American Spitfire Pilot This is an amazing story you must read, then click on the clip below.

This is a great story about a WWII pilot .. 18 years old and just out of high school, who was trained to take pictures of damage done by B-17's to targets in Germany – in a British Spitfire with extra fuel tanks where the guns were... in other words, he flew over Germany unarmed....

It's probably one of the best WWII clips out there. Stored for 61 years, two suitcases of 16mm home movies were inherited by filmaker Willliam Lorton from his great uncle who served as a Flight Surgeon. Those suitcases contained 3 hours of war footage that included a compelling crash landing of a Spitfire in 1944.

Filmed in a 2005 interview with the now 83 year old pilot and seeing the expression on his face when he realizes it is him in the cockpit, is something you somehow won't soon forget.

At 18 years old, he was all alone, behind enemy lines, with no guns, no escort, and he gladly did it. They just don't make them like that anymore. It was truly the greatest generation and we owe them so much.

We owe a BIG thank you to men like him on Remembrance/Veterans Day. November 11th, do not forget .
