From the president's desk.

Only a month to go before your fees are due. We prefer bank account transfers as a method of payment. The final meeting for the year before the AGM is the 29th of June and you can pay your fees then.

The AGM will be held on the 18th of August. Last year we had a member pay fees with almost the total amount in coins. If tried again this year your fee payment will not be accepted in this form. We will accept a maximum of \$5 in large denomination coins only. I won't go into whether this is contrary to the amount of coins acceptable as legal tender, this is a club requirement .

IMPORTANT: A new requirement for renewal this year is for every member to provide an form of electronic communications contact. That is a mobile phone capable of receiving emails and your email address so that you can obtain notification of mosquito spraying via your phone or computer. Sorry, but if you do not provide this information with your renewal we cannot accept your renewal application. This is a council requirement and is part of the new lease agreement. It may not be what you think is fair but that sadly is going to be the future if you want to be a member of this club. Times are-a-changing and not always for the better it seems.

The new lease should be signed by the time you read this.

James and I attended a meeting with MBRC where we were given information to help with grant applications from several sources. Mosquito spraying conditions were again discussed with a council representative at this meeting. We will still continue to discuss the restrictions resulting from the spraying operations with the hope that requirements may be more acceptable at some time in the future.

I am in the process of obtaining a first aid kit for Uhlmann road and also snake bite kits for both fields.

You will probably have noticed the round runway markers on the strips at Brays Rd. There will be few more markers as soon as they are made. The idea is to make the strips more defined. This is to indicate to the mozzie sprayers and overflying aircraft that our field at Brays Rd is still in operation. This was suggested by a member and has be acted upon. The sports complex which will eventually encompass the Brays field is in the process of being planned . I discussed this recently with MBRC and will keep you up to date as the planning progresses

and we can obtain more information. This would indicate that our time at Brays Road will eventually come to an end. Hopefully this will still be a few years away unless some actions by a member causes a far earlier loss. I have been assured our use of the Brays road field is ONLY JUST being tolerated by MBRC and it would take very little to lose this field.

You have my word on this!

Luckily we have a top class field at Uhlmann Road that is continually being improved. Our next objective there is to have the Pit areas concreted and a couple of tanks installed.

That is about it for this month so keep flying and also consider whether you would like to nominate for a committee position for the next twelve months.

Preventing Snake Bites.

One of the members from Lake Macquarie Miniature Aircraft Club has had a very close encounter with a dangerous snake when retrieving his plane from a grassy area of the runway. Please always practice caution if retrieving any craft from areas that may be perfect places for snakes to hide.

USEFUL TIPS TO REMEMBER:

1. Be aware of your surroundings at all times. Don't just blindly wander through woods, weeds, trails, bushes and the like.
2. Avoid specific snake bite habitats like brush piles, debris mounds, logjams, root systems, abandoned buildings, watery areas, "cover" in general. Remember they may be anywhere else also!
3. Wear leather shoes or boots at least ankle high or better when walking in suspected snake country.
4. Never sit or climb (feet and hands), or step over obstacles anywhere without first looking carefully prior to making the move.



Online Warning

A member recently made an online purchase with a well known hobby provider in the Asia region and wishes to share his experience. A purchase was made and paid for by credit card. Having made several transactions before it was customary to receive a confirmation email from the hobby retailer directly after purchasing.

No email was received.

Twenty four hours later he followed up on the chat line and was advised the credit card had to be verified before an email was sent. Still no email at this point.

Three days later he contacted them again, provided the order number and was asked to photo copy his credit card (covering up the middle four numbers) and also provide other ID.

Becoming suspicious the member asked why the online retailer would not give a reason for asking for these extra details as this had not been required with previous orders. He then cancelled the order immediately.

Members are urged to be careful if shopping online with so called "reputable" retailers. If asked to provide additional information not requested in the transaction process be wary of proceeding any further.

Consider purchasing from your local hobby shop.
