Many years ago **Col Parry** acquired these prop blades from Stan Pullen who was a long time member of the club from BARCS days, and decided they needed sprucing up in his honour and for the forthcoming airshow on **Sunday 14 September**.

Stan was a pilot with the Government Air Wing and was in command of the government jet until he developed a problem with vertigo. Newer members may wonder where these props came from. The five larger blades are from a King Air, possibly from Joh Bjelke Petersen's aircraft and this three blade one is from a Cessna 210. There is a photo frame in the clubhouse just above the coffee facilities.

Jon Carney' Speed Bird

Jon maidened this brand new jet at Maryborough Jets on August 3. Mick Barr said he was a natural and took to flying like a duck to water. Definitely not the same as flying an IC but Jon has lots of "experience" at flying various types and sizes of planes so it wasn't entirely foreign to him. It didn't take long to get the hang of it....only one valium required pre flight!

It's a PST Reaction and power plant is a 14kg turbine. Flew like it belongs in the air. Very accurate and no wing drop on landing. Has air and wheel brakes, a 750 ml smoke tank, 5 batteries and 10 channels flown on his DX18.

Dry weight is 13kg. One at Maryborough was clocked as slow as 27 kmh and as fast as 260 So a huge flight envelope. It's built as a trainer and was recommended to Jon by Chris Center from Coolum club as the best trainer around. He's been in jets for about 11 years with plenty of knowledge and experience.



Fuselage is 2.2m long, wingspan 2m. All up weight including fuel and smoke fuel, 17kg. Engine is a Kingtech k140g kero start, 3.5L fuel tank for a 10 minute flight.

We look forward to seeing it entertain the crowd at the Airshow **14th September.**

Drones Come Under Scrutiny

What happens in the USA often has a flow on effect to other countries whether we like it or not. With the ever present threat of terrorism in everybody's minds the thought of a drone being used to further their cause is something not to be ignored. With this in mind the FAA is reviewing drones in general but more specifically FPV's.

We recently saw footage of a drone in the USA hovering above a crowd at a public gathering which was knocked down by people throwing items at it much to the delight of the crowd.

A total ban on commercial drones would kill off dozens of Drone/UAV programs in universities and educational institutions not to mention drone manufacturing companies who have been developing and producing them legally for years.

It would appear that technology has been evolving faster than regulators can make rules which has created a headache of major proportions.

In Australia recently a 6.30pm TV program showed footage a drone flying above the Q1 building on the Gold Coast breaching all safety and privacy issues. It's flight was posted on the internet which is being studied by Police and CASA.


Drones have been useful and often used by safety organisations, high rise maintenance personnel and search and rescue bodies. One was used recently to locate an elderly man in his 80's who had been missing for three days. Volunteers and dogs had spent days searching for him in the snow and a drone owner located him within 30 minutes.

From the point of view of model plane clubs it would seem obvious that owners/flyers be licensed or at the very least, only be permitted to fly them in controlled areas. Gun owners must be licensed and be a member of a gun club. Lets follow the developments and hope commonsense prevails without knee jerk reactions from those who make the regulations, or emotional radio jocks with uninformed comments.

Minutes: General Meeting
Date: 25/07/2014
Chair: Brad Jory

Present: Quorum present as per attendance book.

Meeting commenced: 7:32pm; Apologies: Dick Hall & Dave Anderson.

Previous minutes – correct as published in Airwaves. Moved: Ian Rae, Seconded: Barry Evans All members in favour.

Business arising from previous minutes: The President reported that a cheque had been written in payment for the purchase of a defibrillator that was voted for at a previous meeting.

Presidents Report: The President congratulated members for the good turn out at the July BBQ and reminded members that the AGM will be held next month. The President went on to invite members to nominate for committee positions.

Secretary's Report: The Secretary welcomed new members including: Arthur Bennett, Gordon Bennett and Barry Fletcher.

Treasurers Report: The Treasurer offered up a written treasurers report current as at 25/07/2014. He went on to advise members that the financial records had been delivered to the auditors today. He advised that the club made a profit of around \$12 000.

CFI Report: The CFI reminded the meeting that members need to remain cognisant of noise as the club had been approached in relation to noise at Sid Bray Field. Bob Moore advise the meeting and thanked Greg Petherick for his donation of an 50cc 87" Sbach for persons to get a taste of IMAC style flying. The offer is open to proficient pilots who wish to experience larger aerobatic models.

Fuel Report: Bob Moore advised that the cost of fuel had risen from \$35 to \$36. He also advised that 5 litre fuel containers will attract a \$5.00 deposit to encourage members to bring back their empties.

Pro Report: Greg Petherick advised that he had made a little progress towards the air show and is awaiting a reply from CASA. The meeting was advised that MAAA had agreed to promote the air show. Greg raised the issue of access to the sailing club at **North Pine Dam. Barry Evans** expressed concern over limitations to entry. The President spoke in relation to the requirements of the sailing club and advised that there will be 6 custodians of keys at SAAMBR who will be responsible for their control. Those key holders will also be responsible to ensure that visiting SAAMBR members are familiar with the rules of the sailing club and that there is no requirement for the designated key holder to attend the sailing club with visiting members.

Graham Kennedy raised concerns regarding the air show not being held for charity as was the case in previous years and that the non-charity status of the event may incur a cost for the Morayfield Shopping centre display. The President advised Graham that a vote was previously taken at a general meeting not to run a 'charity' air show. Graham Kennedy subsequently stood down as the air show display coordinator.

The president advised that he had spoken to council about access to the field via Elizabeth Road for the air show however they showed little concern. The club has approached the council seeking permanent signage and are awaiting a response. He advised the meeting that SAAMBR enjoy a good relationship with the council and wish to maintain that relationship.

Airwaves: Nil report this month.

Motion that all reports be accepted as read: Moved: Barry Evans. Seconded: Ian Rae. All members in favour.

General Business: Barry Evans advised the cost of replacing wind socks is becoming prohibitive and sought to purchase 10 at a cost of \$52 from Hobby King. Wind socks will be purchased when the remaining stock is depleted. He also expressed concern regarding insurance coverage while flying at the sailing club as the MAAA MOP may void insurance where members fly alongside persons holding alternate coverage.

Uhlmann Road Field: Graham Tattersall spoke re the development of Uhlmann Road Field and asked the meeting to consider the establishment of a club house at Uhlmann Road. He advised that he has had discussions with Shed Zone and obtained a quote for a 12m x 7 m shed with an 8m awning, lined/insulated and vermin proofed with 3 x whirly birds at a cost of \$31 000. The cost incorporates the cost of the slab and a roof over the existing toilets. The quote also includes all relevant engineers' reports and council approvals. Graham advised that the quote includes raising the floor to mitigate ingress of flood water. He will seek out comparative quotes and stated that he and Jeff Hunwick can coordinate developments.

Danny Hollis recommended that timelines be established to ensure members are aware of the pending decisions regarding Uhlmann Road and may participate. He recommended that deadlines be published in Airwaves. Jeff Hunwick advised that Bill Darby and Frank are maintaining their involvement in the Uhlmann Road site development.

Jim Fagan has provided an alternate quote to the President for consideration.

Raising funds: The President raised the prospect of promoting the use of Sid Bray Field on four occasions throughout the year to raise funds for the club. That use would involve closing the field to general flying and provide an opportunity to raise funds through camping fees, pilot registration fees and/or the sale of food and drink. This approach has been most rewarding for other clubs. The proposal is not intended to impact on the hosting of SCARF Warbirds events at the field.

Eric Pond raised the issue of water quality at the Sid Bray field and enquired as to the likelihood of having the tank water tested. Andrew Holloway advised that he has contact that may facilitate such testing. In the mean time a sign is to be placed at the tap indicating that the water is not potable.

Motion: Graham Tattersall moved a motion "That the field be made available on 4 weekends per year to paying special interest groups." **Seconded**: Danny Hollis. Carried.

Danny Hollis advised that membership cards are out and available for collection. He further advised of a new hobby shop opened in Lawnton opposite Bunnings. He advised they are keen to involve themselves with the club. Danny displayed a delta wing model he had constructed from cheap foam board obtained from the Riot outlet. He encouraged members to consider building the simple model to fly combat at the air show.
